- a Marketing Slalom Plan: Ongoing
  - b **Uptown Farmers Market Collaborative:** Conversations ongoing, bringing in other NAs to help support this, opportunity to collaborate on resource and support; More we can do across orgs, more we support each other and sense of community
- b. Staff Report: Cuyler Dinegan, Coordinator
  - a **Our final 2022 payment requests** with the City were *finally* approved this means ~\$11K that was previously spent out our finite General Fund and NRP Fund, has been reimbursed through funds that expired at the New Year.
    - i Thanks to you all for a quick turnaround on approving my contract to reach renters through digital communications!
    - ii This will start with rental mgmt comms, online content pulling from priorities survey outcomes, and a small survey to you all, to determine what we want out of a revised website
    - iii How checks working on that?
  - b **501c3 filing** is nearing completion we've finalized the Articles of Inc. and I'm doing a round of revisions to attorney Mission Guardian's drafts of the 1023 Form sections. More to come!
  - c **Just signed up for PayPal,** so we'll begin incorporating donation requests into all our print and digital communications going forward.
    - i Thang: No matter how structured, it's imperative we're accountable for how we're using these funds. As we work toward funding, our neighbors, businesses, investors, should always be able to ask how the money's being spent
  - d April Newsletter went out Tuesday, good performance, lot of clicks for our upcoming events (click rate ~8% over 2% avg)
    - i Hoping Bobbie + Lee can start up writing brief interview articles of area businesses?
  - e **Farmers Market Collaborative** Market Manager Jenny and I applied for NCR's Collaboration & Shared Resources Fund. Talked to Steven (NCR Manager): scored well but wrong fit for funding steam, he's supplying alternate possible revenue streams soon
    - i In Discovery phase, meeting with other organizations next week to take temperature (LHENA, EBMS, S Uptown)
- c. Treasurer's Report: Adam Olson, Treasurer
  - a Again, great news that NCR's approved 2022 final payment requests (~\$11K)
    - i Key piece to 2023 Budget, also want to decide Fundraising budget for the year
    - ii Tim: One way to guide Dev. Budget / people doing Dev. Work: Is the plan to go into 2024 to PAY for 2024, and so on into future; As funds get tighter, are we going to

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end this year WITH money for that year? That would push up resources in place to find the money....

- iii Adam: Like that approach. We don't know what to expect from the City in 2024. In theory it could be more... but current trajectory says otherwise.
- b Current balance: \$16K, spent a fair amount on 501c3 (\$3K)

### 5. Old Business

- a. Logo/Marketing Update & Action Slalom Partnership Approved
  - Current roadmap is pro bono, looking at 3-4 months depending on revisions; Step 1: Look and Feel; DocuSigned by Thang
- b. Neighborhood Priority Survey Update
  - 120 responses(!) since opening, will close at the end of April and send gift cards
  - **2/3 respondents are homeowners 45/older,** so hoping my cold-calling and emails with rental property owners will pan out having talked with other Coordinators this is an issue for every single neighborhood association
  - Top priority areas are currently: 1) Public safety, 2) Green issues, 3) Livability
    - i This is reflected in ranked questions and the short answer for how we might choose to spend the uncontracted NRP money
    - ii Also a number of people who believe these three are intertwined, and chose all 3.
  - **Flyering:** Every business accepted a flyer, people were very understanding

  - \$3-\$4K revenue, but NEVER tracked hrs for this and it's a BIG lift
- Labor Day Event Mon. Sept. 4 no volunteers yet
  - Met with Monica this week, who said point blank, "If volunteers don't step up from the community, then the Board agreeing to this event means they're agreeing to help with the planning legwork AND day-of lift to make it happen"
    - Budget usually around ~\$1,200, only parade permit and composting (sustainability) covered by City Funding / never tracked staff hours for this
  - 3 key players: Brad Albertson (donated prizes, Seb Joe's ice cream, administered/ran Bingo); Robin Cooke (buying kid prizes; also provided games for kids (ring toss, go fish)); Monica did everything else (organize band (no longer SW) always had trouble finding volunteers
  - NEED an Event Runner to plan ahead, delegate day-of, volunteer coordination
  - People always did enjoy this, really loved Bingo
  - o Decision to forego Labor Day in face of 2023 financial situation, focus on other events for now
- Super Sale Partnership Sat. Sept. 9, ~9am-3pm
  - o EBMS Event Lead Linda met with EINA's Event Lead Ellen this week, they've locked Sept. 9
  - Linda's worried parking will be an issues with GreekFest running alongside for 3 hours?
  - If it IS an issue, looking at alternate dates...
