### Other:

#### YWCA Uptown Closing

 EBMSNA, along with East Isles, South Uptown, and the Wedge, sent a letter of concern to Mayor and CMs Chughtai and Goodman (Ward 10 & 7) regarding the loss of this community center, hoping to meet about keeping it a community-focused space

#### Ward 10 response:

- Along with the Ward 7 office, we met with the YWCA Mpls president, Shelley Carthen Watson, right after the news broke of its Uptown location's closure. She indicated there were parties interested in acquiring the building, including fitness organizations, but did not give names or a timeline. According to Shelley, the organizations their brokers spoke with were not interested in tearing down the existing building.
- I talked with the Ward 7 office today and, like us, they have not received any updates from the YWCA since our meeting. We will follow up with YWCA leadership and relay your community's questions along with the concerns with the potential vacant parking ramp/building.
- The YWCA has posted an <u>FAQ</u> on their website, which may be useful.
- o Bobbie: "Be nice if another fitness group moved in..."
- Mark: "Worst case scenario would be another parking ramp. Already dealing with transit center issues, ramp could be terrible right there..."
- Bobbie: Uptown Association could take it over? Offer free parking
- Keith: Uptown Theater could be interested?

#### Seven Points

- Ward 10:
  - The development group's affordable housing project (1301 W Lake St) in partnership with Common Bond was approved for a TIF plan back in April. Our office has not received any updates from city staff or the development team since that time in regard to this aspect of the project.
  - As for the renovation of the Seven Points building itself, I've reached out to the principal city planner, Hilary Dvorak, to receive an update. I'll report back what I hear.
- Mark: Seems like they've lost financing, or they would've started by now

## • Recent Shootings near Lagoon Theater:

- Ward 10 Newsletter: We are in communication with the Fifth Precinct Police Inspector to find out any new information they learn about these incidents. MPD has informed us that the gun violence investigations unit is prioritizing this case. We are also working with Inspector Nelson to meet with the property management company for the apartment building where the first incident occurred.
- Ward 7 Newsletter: With Assistant Chief Blackwell leaving, I am proud to introduce our new 5th Precinct Inspector, Christie Nelson. Inspector Nelson has faithfully served with MPD for nearly 26 years. A graduate of the U of M, she joined MPD as a cadet in 1997. As an officer, she held patrol positions in the 3rd and 5th precincts, and has worked as a Sergeant in the 1st, 3rd and 4th precincts, and as a Lieutenant in the 2nd and 3rd precincts. As the new Inspector of the 5th Precinct, Inspector Nelson will oversee patrol and investigations in the area bounded by I-35W in the East, I-94 on the North, and the city limits on the West and South.
